Hello, my name is Willie Mae Aldredge, and I reside at 2013 Del Bay St., Lakewood, CA. I am writing to comment on Item 25 under New Business, the School Naming Policy. I am highly in favor of changing the name of Jordan High School to Felton C. Williams High School. Dr. Williams has served as a member of the Board of Education for the past 16 years, five times as its president, and has been instrumental in the national and international success and academic ranking of the school, particularly in its efforts to improve the academic outcomes for students of color, and in particular, African American students. In addition, he has made significant contributions to the district and the city of Long Beach as follows,

- § Elected president of the African American Cultural Center of Long Beach (2020).
- § Implemented town hall to promote President Barack Obama's My Brothers Keepers project.

- § Recognized by Goodwill Industry SOLAC for the Community Impact Award, 2017.
